Word Origin:

mid 17th cent. (in the sense 'course' or 'direction'): from Latin **ductus** 'leading , aqueduct' from **duct-** 'led', from the verb **ducere**.

Example Bank:

- They managed to get out of the building by crawling through a ventilation duct.
