1. (*informal*) a person who is easily tricked or persuaded to do sth
2. ~ **for sb/sth** (*informal*) a person who cannot resist sb/sth or likes sb/sth very much
• I've always been a sucker for men with green eyes.
3. a special organ on the body of some animals that enables them to stick to a surface
4. a disc shaped like a cup, usually made of rubber or plastic, that sticks to a surface when you press it against it
5. a part of a tree or bush that grows from the roots rather than from the main [↑]stem or the branches and can form a new tree or bush
6. (NAmE, *slang*) used to refer in a general way to a person or thing, especially for emphasis

1. **PERSON** *informal* someone who is easily tricked or persuaded to do something:
" You fell for that old line? Sucker!
2. **be a sucker for somebody/something** *informal* to like someone or something very much, especially so that you cannot refuse them:
" I'm a total sucker for seafood.
3. **PART OF AN ANIMAL** a part of an insect or of an animal's body that it uses to hold on to a surface
4. **SWEET** *American English* a [↑]lollipop
5. **PLANT** a part of a plant that grows from the root or lower stem to become a new plant
6. **RUBBER** a flat round piece of rubber that sticks to a surface by [↑]suction
