**pedi-gree** [pedigree pedigrees] *noun, adjective* BrE ['pedɪɡri:]<sup>Ⓜ</sup> NAmE

1. **countable** knowledge of or an official record of the animals from which an animal has been bred
  - dogs with good pedigrees (= their <sup>↑</sup>ancestors are known and of the same breed)
2. **countable, uncountable** a person's family history or the background of sth, especially when this is impressive
  - She was proud of her long pedigree.
  - The product has a pedigree going back to the last century.

Word Origin:

late Middle English: from Anglo-Norman French **pé de grue** 'crane's foot', a mark used to denote succession in pedigrees.

Example Bank:

- The champions really showed their pedigree today.
- These ideas have a long and distinguished intellectual pedigree.
- These trees have pedigrees stretching back thousands of years.

**adjective** (BrE) (NAmE **pedi-greed**) **only before noun** (of an animal)

coming from a family of the same breed that has been officially recorded for a long time and is thought to be of a good quality

- a pedigree animal comes from a family that has been recorded for a long time and is considered to be of a very good <sup>↑</sup>breed:
- a pedigree greyhound
