a small room that is made by separating off part of a larger room

- a shower cubicle
- (BrE) a changing cubicle (= for example at a public swimming pool)
- (especially NAmE) an office cubicle

Word Origin:

late Middle English (in the sense 'bedroom'): from Latin *cubiculum*, from *cubare* 'lie down'.
