Word Origin:

[**conclusive conclusively**] late 16th cent. (in the sense 'summing up'): from late Latin *conclusivus*, from Latin *conclus-* 'closed up', from the verb *concludere*, from *con-* 'completely' + *claudere* 'to shut'.
