1. over the side of a ship or boat into the water:

" One of the crew **fell overboard** and drowned.

" Man overboard (=said when someone falls off a boat)!

2. **go overboard** to do or say something that is too extreme for a particular situation:

" I hope politicians will not go overboard in trying to control the press.

3. **throw something overboard** to get rid of an idea, system etc that is considered to be useless or unnecessary**overboard**
