Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (in the sense 'differing in opinion or character'): from Latin **dissident-** 'sitting apart, disagreeing', from **dis-** 'apart' + **sedere** 'sit'.

Example Bank:

- regimes that murder political opponents and imprison dissidents
- Dissidents were often imprisoned by the security police.
