- There was an inscription carved over the doorway.
- There are no inscriptions or markings to identify the tombs.

Word Origin:late Middle English (denoting a short descriptive or dedicatory passage at the beginning of a book): from Latin **inscriptio(n-)**, from the verb **inscribere**, from **in-** ‘into’ + **scribere** ‘write’.Example Bank:

- The inscription bears the date 1655.
- The monument carries the inscription: ‘To the fallen in two world wars’.
- The monument carries the inscription: ‘To the fallen’.
- The simple inscription on her grave reads: ‘She sleeps in peace.’
- an inscription carved in the stone
