Word Origin:

Middle English: from Scottish Gaelic *bàrd*, Irish *bard*, Welsh *bardd*, of Celtic origin. In Scotland in the 16th cent. it was a derogatory term for a travelling musician, but was later romanticized by Sir Walter Scott.
