3. заручатся (содействием, поддержкой); завербовать (союзника)
to enlist co-operation - заручиться содействием, договориться о совместных действиях
to enlist smb. as one's friend - сделать кого-л. своим другом, склонить кого-л. на свою сторону

Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (formerly also as inlist): from ↑en-, ↑in- 'in, on' + list 'enlist for military service', perhaps suggested by Dutch *inlijsten* 'put on a list'.
