- especially British English** quick to react in an angry way **SYN irritable** :
 - She seemed snappy and impatient.

 - There's no need to be so snappy with the children.
- make it snappy** (also **look snappy** *British English*) **informal** used to tell someone to hurry:
 - Get me a drink, and make it snappy.
- British English informal** snappy clothes, objects etc are attractive and fashionable:
 - a snappy suit
