Word Origin:

Middle English pentis (originally referring to an outhouse or shelter with sloping roof), shortening of Old French *apentis*, based on late Latin *appendicium* 'appendage', from Latin *appendere* 'hang on'. The change of form in the 16th cent. was by association with French *pende* 'slope' and ↑house.

- The hotel has 54 fully appointed rooms plus a luxury penthouse suite.
