traditional form [morality] - традиционная форма [мораль]
- 2) традиционный, обычный, часто повторяющийся
the traditional luck of fools - ≅ дуракам всегда везёт
he can never go back to his traditional occupation - он никогда не сможет вернуться к своим обычным занятиям
- 3) традиционный, несовременный, устаревший
