1. **transitive** ~ **sb** to take a weapon or weapons away from sb  
• Most of the rebels were captured and disarmed.
2. **intransitive** (of a country or a group of people) to reduce the size of an army or to give up some or all weapons, especially nuclear weapons  
• The government was reluctant to disarm.
3. **transitive** ~ **sb** to make sb feel less angry or critical  
• He disarmed her immediately by apologizing profusely.  
• The best way to disarm your critics is to make them laugh.

1. **[intransitive]** to reduce the size of your army, navy etc, and the number of your weapons **OPP arm**:  
Getting the rebels to disarm will not be easy.
2. **[transitive]** to take away someone's weapons **OPP arm**:  
Captured soldiers were disarmed and put into camps.
3. **[transitive]** to make someone feel less angry or disapproving of you, and more friendly ⇒ **disarming**:  
His tact and political skills disarmed his critics.
4. **[transitive]** to take the explosives out of a bomb, ↑missile etc
